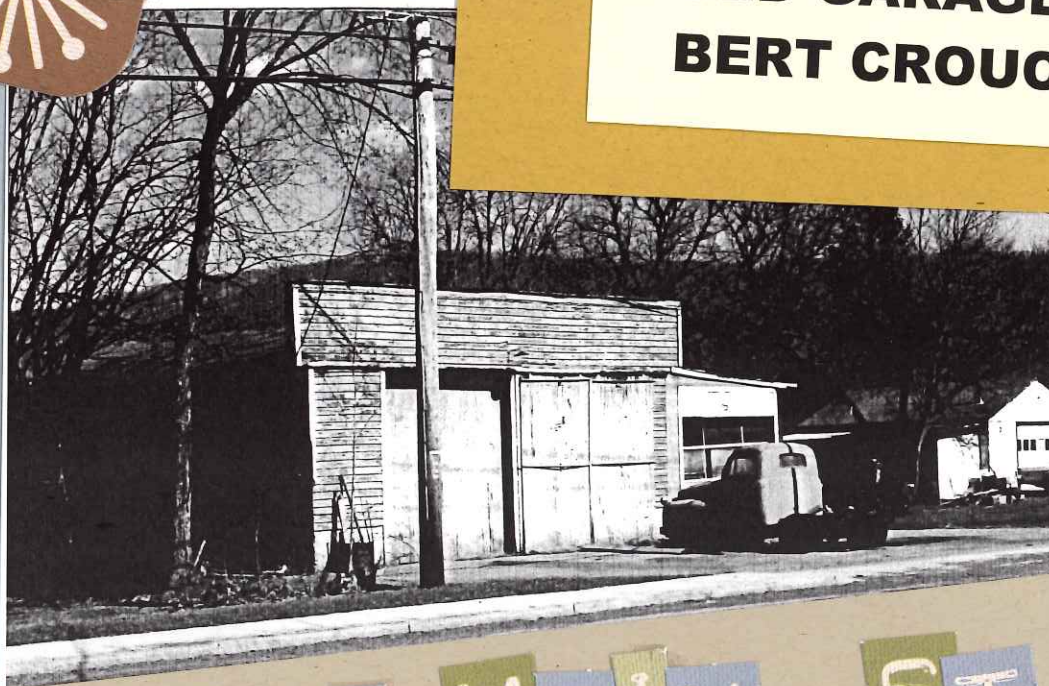

The town board hereby authorizes the town clerk to post notices of meeting of town board on the 28th day of May 1925 to consider such petition and any objections thereto at 1 P.M. on 28th day of May 1925 - Carried

To the Town Board of the Town of Campbell
The undersigned tax payers do hereby petition the Town Board of the Town of Campbell to establish a Fire District in said town, as provided for in the Town Law said district to be bounded as follows:-

Commencing at a point where the East line of lands owned by Harry Eccles touches the State Highway, thence along said State Highway in a westerly direction to the lane leading to Mrs. H. H. Manning, including all side streets, Center Church, Benisrd Clinton on west side of said Highway, also the Highway leading across the Cohocton River to the intersection of the highway leading up and down the west side of the river.

Campbell N.Y. May 28-1925

A meeting of Town Board of Town of Campbell held on May 28-1925 at office of Supervisor Present Ira M. Platt Supr. J.D. Hamilton Town Clerk Justices Symonds, Crouch, Clark & Burlingame. Motion made & seconded that the following Resolution to establish a fire district in the Town of Campbell be adopted.

Whereas, a petition for the establishment of a fire district in the town of Campbell, N.Y. signed by a majority of the tax payers of such proposed district was filed more than 30 days heretofore with the town clerk of said town and on the 20th day of April 1925, and whereas the town board of said town has caused a notice to be posted for one week prior to this date in six public and conspicuous places in said district of the filing of said petition and that the same would be acted upon by said town board at this time and place and whereas, it appears proper and expedient to this board that such a fire district be established in said town, now therefor be it resolved that a fire district be and the same hereby is established in the Town of Campbell, Steuben Co., New York which shall be bounded as follows:

Commencing at a point where the east line of lands owned by Harry Eccles touches the State Highway, thence along said State Highway in a westerly direction to the lane leading to Mrs. N. H. Mannings including all side streets (Center, Church, Benis^{3rd} & Clinton) on north & east side of said highway, also the highway leading across the Cohocton River to the intersection of the highway leading up and down the west side of the Cohocton river. Carried

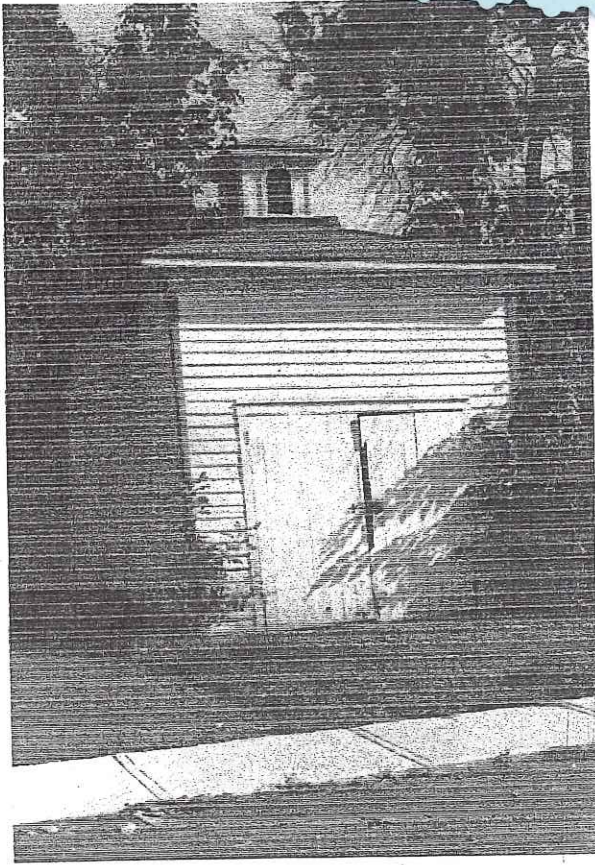

Platt of Kansas City, a small but suitable building has been donated to the town and has been moved from the Platt property to a vacant lot adjoining the Joint Hardware and the fire chemical is installed.

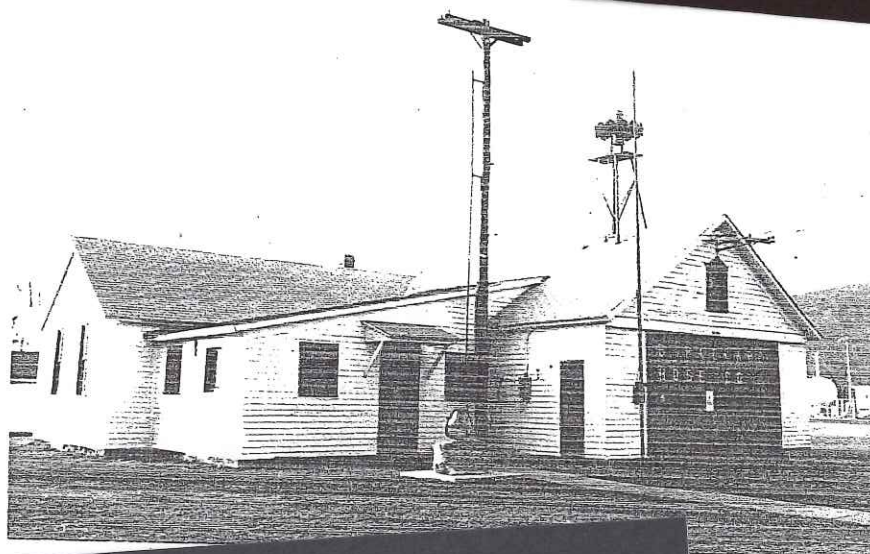

The **"CAMPBELL DAIRYMEN'S CORPORATION"** existed in Campbell for at least 26 years; They operated a cheese factory at the corner of Church St. and Clinton Street. The company's president was **JOHN C. THARP**, an original member of the Campbell Fire Department. The Company's Secretary and Treasurer was **IRA M. PLATT**, the father of G. Donald Platt, an original fire department member.

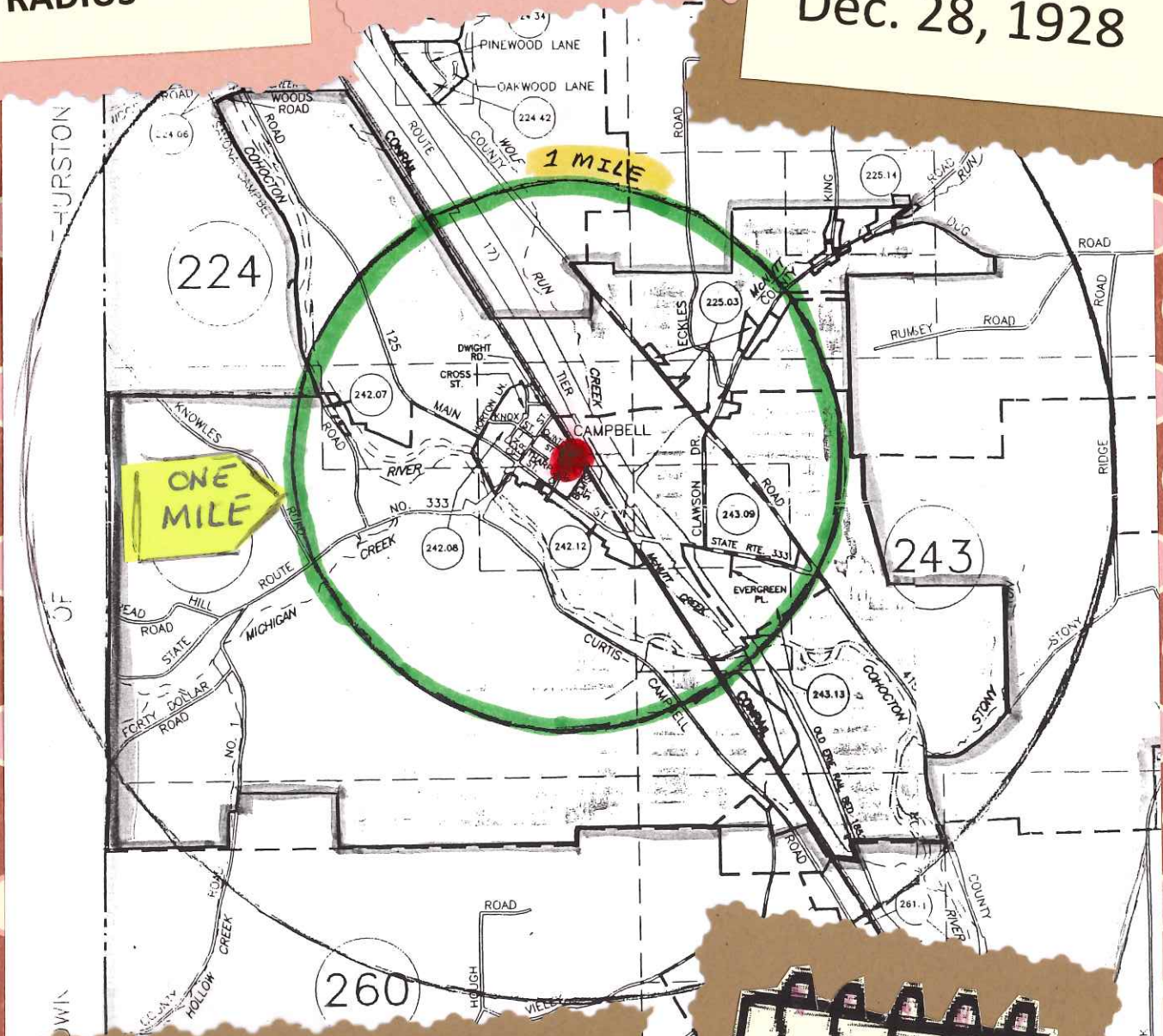
Some records say it was purchased in 1942 instead of 1945. Unknown why there is a difference.

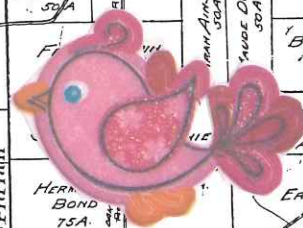

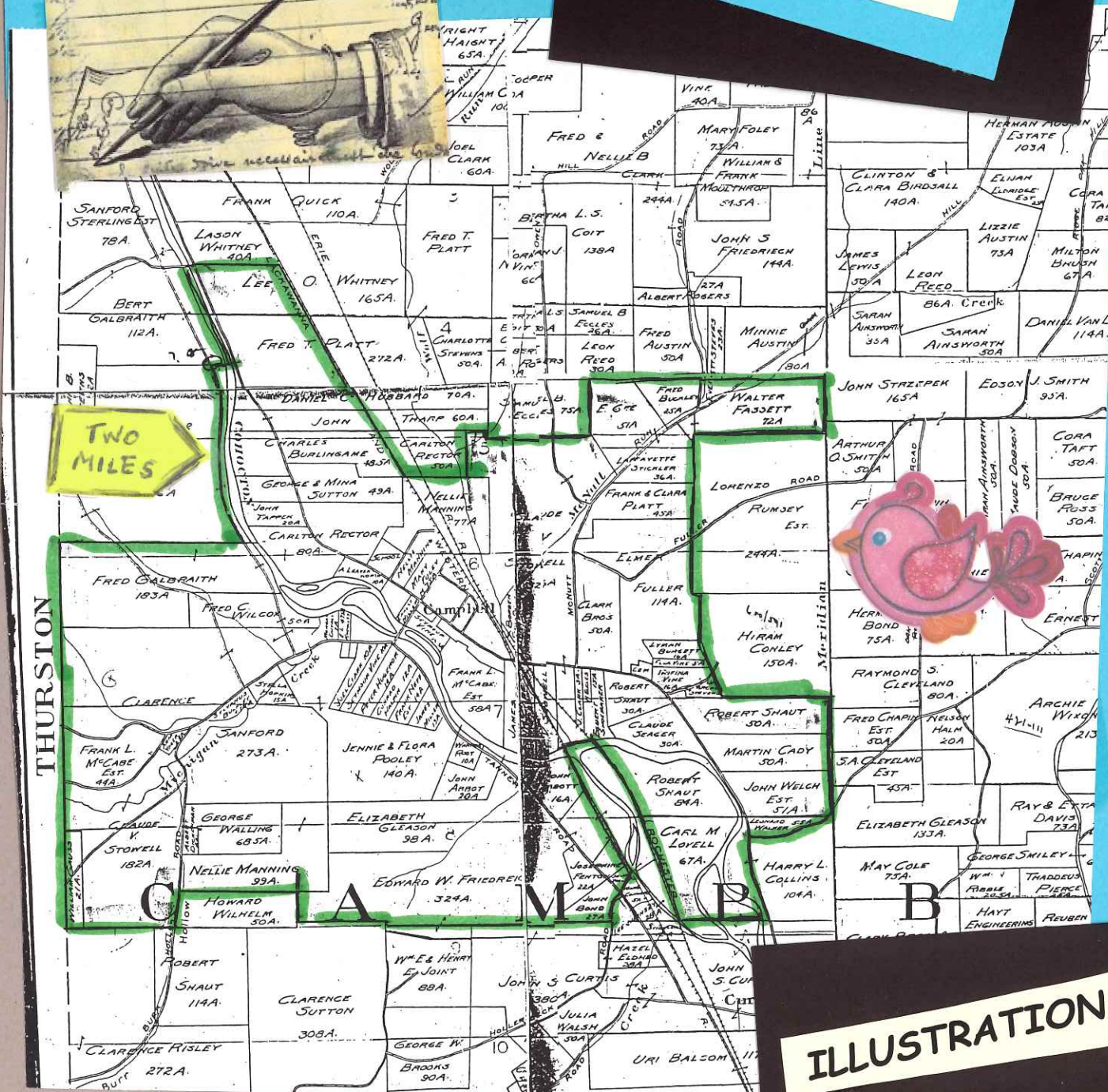

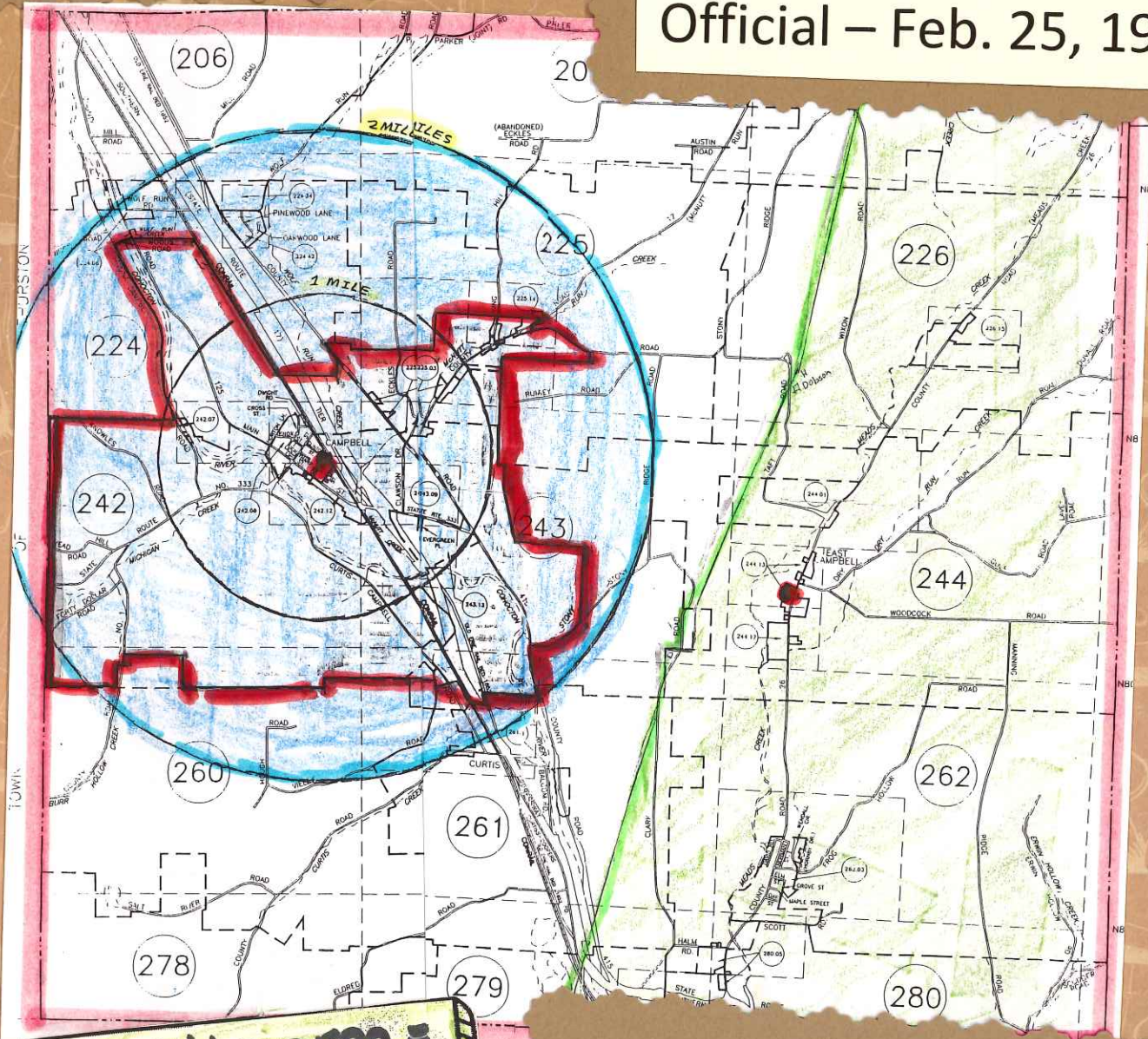
